




Going "green" is decidedly better for the environment if you're speaking in terms of less indis-

From our Kitchen

Aunt Carol's Cream Cheese Brownie Squares

Ingredients:

- 3 oz cream cheese
- 3 large eggs
- 4 oz Baker's German's Sweet Chocolate
- 1 cup sugar
- 5 T butter
- ½ cup chopped walnuts
- ½ cup plus 1 additional tablespoon un-sifted flour
- 1 ½ teaspoon vanilla
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon almond extract

Preheat your oven to 350 degrees F (177C). Melt the chocolate and 3 tablespoons of butter over low heat while stirring constantly. Allow the mixture to cool.

Now beat cream cheese with 2 tablespoons of butter until soft. Slowly add in ½ cup of sugar and continue beating until light and fluffy. Add 1 egg, 1 tablespoon of flour, and ½ teaspoon of vanilla. Set cheese mixture aside.

Whip the remaining two eggs thoroughly until fluffy. Now slowly add ³/₄ cup of sugar and beat until thick. Fold in ¹/₂ teaspoon of salt, and ¹/₂ cup of flour. Add to the cooled chocolate mixture and blend together. Mix in 1 teaspoon of vanilla, almond extract and walnuts.

Set 1 cup of the batter to the side. Grease an 8 x 8 pan. Spread remaining chocolate batter in pan. Pour cheese mixture over top. Spoon the chocolate onto the cheese mixture and swirl with a spatula to create marbling. Bake for 35-40 minutes. Allow to cool. Cut into squares. Cover and refrigerate.




